Next Friday, 17th June is a non-uniform day to help is source more library books.

Over the year we have been developing our approach to reading in school. We have developed our early phonics approach through RWI and started to use Accelerated Reader so that we know every child is reading books suitable for them; ensuring they can read the text they bring home as well as understand what they have read. In order to make this happen we have sought funding from companies to buy books to develop our library. Through your continued support we have been able to hold 2 book fairs raising over £1,000 for the school to spend on books. We are very grateful.

As is always the case, new books come out, the children find different authors they want to read books written by and so we are always sourcing new books to keep them inspired. On Friday 17th June we would like to hold a non-uniform day to help raise money to buy some of these books and broaden the range we have. We are therefore asking for the children to come to school in their own clothes and in return to either give a donation for us to buy a book, bring a book from home which is good quality, suitable for children and no longer needed.
