Our Head Teacher and Business Manager forums and groups have been lit up with discussion between schools. There has been a great deal of agonising. Every school has a different context and taken a range of approaches, including full school closure, full opening or partial closure like us. As teachers, like yourselves as parents, we do all ultimately have your children's best interests at the very heart of all the decisions we make.

For the duration of the <u>strike</u>, I have added a page to the website under 'Parents' where you can find my letter with information and a parent leaflet from the teacher's union, the NEU.

I would like to thank *all* parents (those who have expressed support and those who disagree) for your understanding and very much hope we can all move forwards positively together in the best interests of your children.

Curriculum News

Two years ago we took the decision to re-design the learning experience in Years 1 and 2 so we could base it on the best practice continuous provision model used in Reception. This helps make learning more child-led and therefore more relevant and engaging. Mrs Tandy has been leading on this and has been updating a wonderful Continuous Provision in K\$1 Blog. Recently, she has added a new section titled, Continuous Provision across the Curriculum. In here you can see how children have used learnt skills to initiate their own learning in Maths, Science and Art... with remarkable outcomes. Well worth a look. I think it is a super example of the excellent education teachers provide for your children.

I hope you had a chance to have a look at the new *Kids Zone* on the website. Since last week there is a new video on how to punctuate direct speech and two videos on how to use cognates (similar sounding words) to translate from French to English.
